TRUISM

1

A statement that is obviously true and says nothing new or interesting / सत्यवाद

1. Orpington seems an example of the **truism** that nothing succeeds like success.
2. It is an obvious **truism** that people act in accordance with their motives

COURTEOUS

2

polite and respectful to other people / शिष्ट

1. He was a kind and **courteous** man.
2. My friend's reply was **courteous** but firm.

VENERABLE

3

being respect because of your age, personality, status etc / सम्मानित

1. The thought of making money at the expense of these **venerable** institutions was hugely tempting.
2. The **venerable** A-level celebrates its 54th birthday this year.

MODIFY

4

Making changes / परिवर्तन

1. She may be prepared to **modify** her views.
2. To lead, you have to discuss and be prepared to **modify** your position.

CONSCIENCE

5

the feeling in your mind that tells you if what you are doing is right or wrong / अंतकरण

1. That's between you and your **conscience**.
2. I have a clear **conscience** – I didn't do anything wrong.

DRENCHED

1

Wet thoroughly, soaked/ पूरी तरह भीग जाना

1. I got **drenched** while walking home in rain.
2. Do not move around the house in your **drenched** clothes.

PROFOUND

2

Very great or intense / गहरा

1. Her knowledge in history is **profound**.
2. The speaker's **profound** words made me think about my future.

INEXPENSIVE

3

Not costing a great deal; cheap/ सस्ता

1. We stocked a wide range of **inexpensive** wines.
2. These houses are small and **inexpensive**; ideal for first buyers.

SWIFT

4

Happening quickly; very fast/ तीव्र

1. The police took **swift** action against the criminals.
2. Her **swift** responses are an asset to the team.

CONSISTENT

5

Regularity, steady or continuity / एक सा, समान

1. Being **consistent** to achieve your goals is crucial.
2. The pain in my back has been **consistent**.

WORDS

EMINENT

1

Famous and respected within a particular sphere./ श्रेष्ठ

- Mr Narendra Modi is an **eminent** personality in India.
- She is **eminent** as a painter.

DESTITUTE

2

Poor enough to need help from others/ बेसहारा

1. By the end of today's match, Rony was nearly **destitute**.
2. The floods left thousands of people **destitute**.

DIVISIVE

3

Caused by disagreement/ असहमति

1. That politician is a **divisive** influence in meetings.
2. The **divisive** proposal split the committee into two parts.

SPECULATION

4

To make guesses about something without enough information/ अनुमान

1. He dismissed their theories as mere **speculation**.
2. Her **speculations** has left her alone and with no family.

BEWITCH

5

To feel strong attraction towards something / मोहित

1. He was **bewitched** by the beauty of Taj Mahal.
2. The prince was **bewitched** by the sorceress.

WORDS

ASSET

1

A useful and valuable thing or person \ संपत्ति

- 1.The school is an **asset** to the community.
- 2.They are a highly-qualified couple and would be a wonderful **asset** to this country.

PIONEER

2

Develop or be the first to apply/ मार्ग दर्शक

- 1.He is regarded as a **pioneer** in the field of computer music.
- 2.In the meantime, he managed to **pioneer** what is now known as cultural studies.

HUNCH

3

A feeling or guess based on intuition rather than fact / आभास होना

- 1.I have a **hunch** that someone is telling lies.
- 2.She got a **hunch** of this deal.

EXCLUSIVE

4

Restricted to the area or person confirmed/ विशेष

- 1.They sent him to one of the most **exclusive** schools in the country.
- 2.I have reserved a room for your **exclusive** use.

LEGITIMATE

5

Confirming to the law or to the rules /सच्चा

- 1.The Crown Court judge refused to accept this as a **legitimate** use of the power.
- 2.A **legitimate** business will not make promises that are too good to be true.

IMPACT

1

A marked effect or influence/ प्रभाव

- 1.The recent policy changes have had an **impact** for local businesses.
- 2.No one could have survived such an **impact**.

DISRUPTION

2

Disturbance or problems which can interrupt an event, activity, or process/ बाधा

1. There would be severe **disruption** to their lives if they had to move.
- 2.The teacher says he causes **disruption** in class.

INCENTIVIZE

3

Motivate or encourage to do something; provide with an incentive/प्रोत्साहित

1. The government wants to **incentivize** people to switch to greener cars.
2. The rising cost of electricity provides a strong **incentive** to conserve energy.

IDEATE

4

Form an idea; imagine or conceive/ विचार करना

1. They were asked to **ideate** a new system.
2. It's about giving them a great environment, an environment where they can **ideate**, collaborate.

AMPLIFY

5

The extension and enlargement of something/ बढ़ाना

- 1.Then there is power for the witness to be able to **amplify** his statement.
- 2.The notes **amplify** information contained in the statement.
