GLUT

a supply of something that is much more that can be sold or is needed or wanted/ भरमार

VERSATILE

able to do many different things or to adjust to new conditions / बहुमुखी

- 1. He was a versatile guitarist, and recorded with many leading rock bands.
- 2. It is an especially **versatile** insecticide known to control a range of insects.

DILIGENT

careful and hardworking/ परिश्रमी

- 1. Their lawyer was extremely diligent in preparing their case.
- 2. The discovery was made after years of diligent research.

RIENFORCEMENT

the action of strengthening or encouraging something /सहायक सेना

- 1. They are working on the reinforcement
- of the sea-wall. 2. The details are a reinforcement of the

impression we had already got.

GULLIBLE

- 1.I'm not **gullible** enough to believe something that outrageous.

DISTANT

Far away in time or space/ दूर

- 1. The star is 30,000 light years **distant** from Earth.
- 2.The **distant** bark of some farm dog"

- 2. She cited cases in which women had received inferior healthcare.

FLATTER

giving someone compliments or praise to make them feel pretty and smart/ बढ़ाना चढ़ाना

- 1. He **flattered** her with comments about her youthful appearance.
- 2. His comments flattered her.

SOLITUDE

the state of being alone, in a good way / अकेलापन

- 1. All was peace, light and solitude which can do strange things to a person."
- 2. Yet we have a better chance of solitude here than on most islands.

AMENITIES

desirable facilities of a place or a building सुविधायें

- 1. The local roads, services, amenities, houses and schools are not large enough.
- 2. He also pointed out the concerns over traffic and the lack of amenities.

ORIGIN

a place where something has been born has risen from / प्रारंभिक

- 1. The disorder in military policy had its origins in Truman's first term.
- 2. Their medical problems are basically physical in origin.
