ELEGANCE

2

A refined quality of gracefulness and good taste / लालित्य

2. She was the personification of **elegance**.

SIGNIFIED

3

The meaning of a word or expression / अभिव्यंजना

1. This decision **signified** a radical change in their policies
2. Alexander **signified** his consent with a nod.

IMPECCABLE

4

Without any mistakes or faults; perfect / परिपूर्ण

1. She has **impeccable** taste in music.
2. His manners are **impeccable**.

HUMBUG

5

Something intended to deceive / पाखंड

1. You can only **humbug** those who are not aware of your tricks.
2. There was all the usual **humbug** and obligatory compliments from ministers.

Extreme excess / ढेर सारा

PERMUTE

3

Change the order or arrangement of / परम्यूट

1. Components to **permute** and combine into a dazzling array of services ?
2. Thus we can orient and **permute** the corners, using the algorithm

INFALLIBLE

4

Incapable of failure or error / अचूक

1. Although he was experienced, he was not **infallible**.
2. Computer spell checkers are useful but far from **infallible**.

TANGLED

5

in a confused mass / टैंगल्ड

1. He got **tangled** with the budget figures.
2. The cotton was cleaned and opened and then fed into the machine into the **tangled** mess.
